Recycling used batteries helps protect the environment and conserve natural resources.

Why is Battery Recycling Important?

Batteries contain valuable materials and chemicals such as lead, cadmium, zinc, lithium, and mercury. If disposed of with household waste, they end up in landfills, leading to resource loss and potential risks to the environment and human health. Recycling helps reduce these hazards and allows valuable materials to be reused.

When you dispose of batteries properly, they go through a recycling process where their components are recovered and used to manufacture new batteries.

#Be environmentally conscious – dispose of your batteries at the right locations!

Important Labels

All batteries are labeled with a crossed-out wheelie bin symbol, indicating that they must not be disposed of with household waste but should be taken to designated recycling points.

Batteries containing hazardous substances are also marked with the following chemical symbols:

- Hg Mercury
- Cd Cadmium
- Pb Lead



How to Recycle Batteries

✓ You can drop off your old batteries and rechargeable batteries free of charge at public collection points in your municipality or at stores that sell batteries.
